The Discovery Halls are an ever-changing resource for educators. Spend time with hands-on exhibits and the exhibit guides we provide upon request. School groups can attend public shows, scheduled throughout the day at no extra charge.

Water for Life - Dive into the world of aquatic animals. Visit the Reef Room and get up close and personal with the species in the Touch Pool.

Kids Place - Children ages 6 and under use their senses to experience exhibits including the water table, animal tree, magnets, dinosaurs and more.

Once in the Wild - Explore this impressive collection of animals from North America.

Our Living Planet - Touch a simulated tornado, check out the weather or view our gem collection while exploring video presentations and interactive exhibits.

Life Center - Get physical with exhibits related to human health, growth and development. Explore the exhibit, *As the Beat Goes On...*, or take a walk through the giant eyeball.

Science Talk - Ride the air chair and draw hi-tech pictures with the harmonograph. Enjoy demonstrations on biology, physics and chemistry at *Einstein's Corner*.

Machine Shop - Explore the science behind simple machines. Test students' strength as they lift an ATV or pull their own weight up in our pulley chairs.

Knight Rain Forest - Travel deep into the heart of a tropical rain forest with this collection of animals and plants.

Discover the magic behind the movies! Go behind the scenes and into the minds of today's greatest movie makers. See how movies are created and what it takes to get from script to the silver screen. Watch as make-up and costumes turn a beauty into a beast and see how set designers can transport you to another time or place. Look through a real movie camera to see the effects of different lenses and filters. Explore stunt equipment, see robotic models, even control a creature yourself.



In "The Soundstage Experience," students have the opportunity to participate in the production of an actual film.

The soundstage has three working sets complete with all the real movie equipment. Hosted by museum staff, students can take jobs ranging from lighting technician to actor; greensperson to extra. After shooting short scenes, see the shots cut together with stock footage, a soundtrack and professional titles. Students will have the opportunity to view their film on our website for free.
